Many communities in Alaska do not have access to Palliative Care specialty services that could benefit them. Access to Palliative care improves the quality of life for patients, their families and improves access to care for many Alaska Native people.



Palliative care focuses on the relief of pain, symptoms and stress of serious illness to help patients and their family members live peacefully and comfortably. Interdisciplinary palliative care team includes: physician, registered nurse, social worker, dietician, acute pain pharmacist and psychiatrist.
